

# Integrating E-mail Into The Classroom

## Activity Instructions

---

Discuss the following questions with a partner or group. This time is provided for you to brainstorm and gain ideas from your group members.

### **How have you used E-mail with your students (e.g., research, student activities, lesson plans)?**

- On-line mentors
- Talk to the Experts/Primary Resources.
- Share information about environment, cultures, with students in another country.
- Use college students as contacts.
- Homework sent to the teacher.
- Set up an "ASK Mr. Iowa" forum for people in the state to ask students questions about a topic. Students would have to research the question and then report back to the person asking the questions.
- Pen Pals.
- Global classrooms.

### **How have you used E-mail for teaching support (preparation)?**

- Discuss a topic with peers at other institutions.
- Share curriculum with a peer.
- Teachers may exchange math data for a project and then incorporate the data into the class curriculum.
- Talk with the experts for a subject.
- Co-research and/or write a proposal/paper.
