

## Enable Java Plug-Ins

**Purpose:** Java Plug-Ins are used by the Student Information System to present certain data. By default, Java Plug-Ins should be enabled however; browser updates could disable them.

Mozilla Firefox	<ul> <li>Select Tools, Add-ons from the top menu bar or the Firefox icon</li> <li>Firefox  in the upper left corner</li> <li>Click the Plugins option on the left</li> <li>Click the Enable button for the Java plugin</li> </ul>

Internet Explorer	<ul> <li>Select Tools, Manage Add-ons from the menu bar or use the Tools drop- down menu in the upper right corner</li> <li>Scroll down to the <i>Sun Microsystems, Inc. or Oracle America, Inc.</i> section</li> <li>Highlight the Java plug-in that is disabled and click the Enable button. <i>Note:</i> If there are multiple Java plug-ins, enabling the first one usually enables all of them</li> </ul>
