SUE Exhibit:

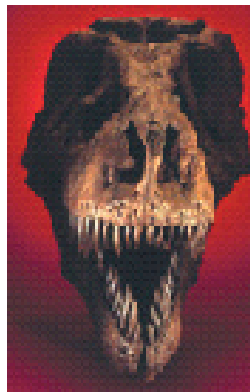
Monday through Friday group time slots are 9:30-11:00, 10:30-12:00, 11:30-1:00 and 12:30-2:00. Plan on spending about 90 minutes from the time you arrive to the time you depart.

Group Reservation Procedure

Confirmation and payment must be received by the University Museum 30 days before the visit. There will be limited refunds after that time. Below are the steps that need to be taken to arrange a group reservation.

- Complete the **online group reservation form**.*
- We will send an invoice for the projected number of people attending.
- You will send us the final number of people attending and payment no less than 30 days before the visit.
- We will send a ticket to be submitted on the day of your visit, a map and some exhibit rules.
- You arrive with your ticket on your scheduled day and have a fun and educational experience with SUE.
