

Come and see the most complete and best preserved skeleton of a Tyrannousaurus Rex to date at the University of Northern Iowa Museum 1326 Waterloo Road Cedar Falls, IA 50613

SUE was a Tyrannosaurus rex who roamed

North America about 67 million years ago, one

of the last dinosaur species and one of the

largest flesh-eaters to have ever inhabited

the Earth. The "tyrant lizard king," with its

extraordinarily powerful jaws and massive ser
rated steak-knife teeth, still dominates popular

perceptions of the Age of Dinosaurs.

Only a handful of T. rex specimens have been found that are about 60% complete. At 90% complete and exquisitely preserved, SUE is the most celebrated member of its species, permitting more detailed studies of the biology, growth, and behavior of T. rex than have previously been possible.
